#### **5.Overview**

The Wallgate ThriiTap<sup>+</sup> is an integrated hand wash dryer unit with automatic infra-red sensor operation.

There are two model options that are otherwise identical except for the Tap head mounting method. It is available as a wall mounted configuration to be installed with the Control Module installed in a service duct on the other side of a wall, and as a deck mounted version to be installed with the Control Module mounted below a basin or vanity top.

These instructions deal with the deck mounted version.

When hands are placed under the centre of the tap head, an infra-red sensor activates the hand washing and drying cycle, supplying soap (liquid or foam), warm water and dryer-air in amounts and intervals preset as required.

The unit can be installed in a variety of wall types, (depending on configuration) and most servicing can be carried out without removing the control module or tap head from its installed position. Note, the appliance is designed to be used in commercial areas.




Figure 1: Deck mounted tap dimensions [mm].

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


Figure 2: Tap head outlet nozzles.
















# 7. Installing the Support Frame, Water, Waste and Electrical Connections

#### 7.1. Pre-installation Guidelines

Warning! This appliance is not to be installed in locations where freezing can occur.

We recommend that adequate frost protection is provided in the building to ensure freezing does not occur.

Note: When selecting a mounting position, it is important to consider the suitability of the wall construction. It must support the weight of the assembled unit as shown in Fig.6.

Note: Water and mains power are located on top of the control module

Make an accurate opening in the deck surface according to the dimensions shown in *Fig.4* noting the appropriate distance from the basin.

Warning! All electrical work must be carried out by a qualified electrician and should be installed in accordance with the current Nationally Approved Regulation

The installer must:

 Provide an electrical supply of 220–240VAC 50/60Hz with a socket suitable for the installation environment. For installations into rooms with baths or showers the control module is to be installed into a switched fused spur. The fused spur must be a 13Amp, double pole connection point that is local to the module (the contact separation of the fused spur switch should be at least 3mm). Earth bonding for this type of module must comply with the nationally approved regulations.

# Warning! The socket / switched fused spur MUST be easily accessible in case of emergency

• Provide a water supply mounted a short distance from the module. Terminate the water supply with a suitable isolating tap. For optimum operation, a dynamic water flow pressure of between 1 & 3 bar is required.

Note: Request advice from Wallgate before you connect the control module to a gravity-fed water supply.

#### 7.1.1. Deck Mounted Tap Head




Figure 3: Deck Mounted Tap mounting guidelines.

Figure 3 shows the minimum allowable air gap between the underside of tap and spill-over level of basin for the deck mounted tap only, to achieve AUK 3 air gap. Please also note the clearance required under the basin and between the basin and wall.





Figure 4: Deck Mounted Tap mounting dimensions.

Measure, mark and core a hole through basin or vanity to the dimensions shown in figure 4 below.

#### 7.2. Mounting Guidelines


#### 7.2.1. Control Module Mounting Guidelines



It is recommended to use the orientation shown above (fig 5).

The control module is to be mounted to a flat wall via the mounting tabs. These are bi-directional slotted for ease of installation regardless of the control modules' orientation.

The control module must be fastened to the wall using mounting hardware suitable for the wall material (to be provided by others), and the wall must be robust enough to support the weight of the wall.




Figure 6: Soap Hook installation.

The control module must have a clearance envelope of 100mm (see Fig 6).

Ensure adequate ventilation to the bottom of the engine **Figure 6**: Minimum control module clearance.

When the module is securely mounted to the wall the power cable should be connected to an easily accessible switched UK plug socket or switched fused spur (depending on installation requirements). The electrical installation must be compliant to local building and electrical regulations.

Warning! All electrical work must be carried out by a qualified electrician and should be installed in accordance with the current Nationally Approved Regulations.

### 7.2.2. Soap Hook Mounting Guidelines

The soap hook can be installed remotely from the module in a position convenient for access, and within space constraints. 0.6m of soap tube is supplied for connection between the soap bottle and the module.

The soap hook must be fastened to the wall with appropriate fasteners for the wall material (to be supplied by others).

#### 7.2.3. Tap Head Mounting Guidelines

#### 7.2.3.1. Deck Mounted Tap Head

- 1. Remove 2x M6 nuts and mounting bracket from tap head.




Figure 7: Tap head installation into vanity top or basin.

- 2. Carefully pass tap head hoses through hole made in basin or vanity before seating washer and tap onto deck as shown in figure 7.

3. Then thread the mounting bracket over to hoses. Position the mounting bracket over the tap assembly and align with the two M6 threaded rods. Secure into position using the M6 nuts and tighten by hand.





Figure 8: Installing fixing bracket.

4. Check the orientation of the tap head is correctly positioned over the basin. Once this is in position gradually tighten each nut equally to 5Nm.



#### 7.3. Connecting the Control Module to the Tap head




Figure 10: Deck mounted tap shown without vanity top




Figure 11: Control Module I/O arrangement.

1. First connect air hose to tap. Ensure jubilee clips are positioned roughly 15mm from each end of air hose. Push one end of air hose over black air hose spigot protruding from bottom of tap head. Then push the other end over the "air outlet spigot" on the module (see fig 11 for reference).




Figure 12: Air hose connection.

2. Ensure each jubilee clip is positioned over spigot and then tighten with flat head screwdriver to hold air hose in place.

3. Now take the flexi hose and check rubber O-ring is fitted correctly in half inch BSP female nut. Then screw on to module "water outlet" by hand. Tighten with 23mm spanner.




Figure 13: Flexi hose / water outlet connection.

4. Next take M8 sensor cable connection from tap head and connect to "sensor connection" on module. Align pins and tighten by hand.




Figure 14: Sensor cable connection.

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5. Take 2x soap hoses from bottom of tap head and push over "soap and air outlets" indicated in fig 11. Use 2x cable ties to secure soap tube onto outlet spigots.




Figure 15: Soap Air outlet connections.

#### 7.4. Mains Water Connection to Control Module

The hand wash unit can be used with various water input methods with all internal components suitable for contact with water up to 60°C.

The water temperature is not controlled by the module therefore a suitable temperature control system must be fitted before the module that is in line with local regulations.

Alternatively, the unit can be operated as cold water only, by directly connecting the module to a cold-water supply.

The unit should be fitted after an isolating valve to allow for ease of maintenance and installation.

1. To connect the control module to the water supply simply screw on a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " BSP connector to the "water inlet" detailed in fig 11.

#### 7.5. Commissioning for use

#### To commission the Wallgate ThriiTap<sup>+</sup>:

- 1. Ensure the control module cover panels are securely fitted and the electrical plug is securely connected to the fused spur.
- 2. Inspect all connections on the top of the Control Module to make sure the air, soap, water, and sensor connections are secure and seated correctly.
- 3. Fully open the mains water supply isolating tap. Check the incoming water connections for leaks.
- 4. Switch ON the power to the Control Module, this will power-up the Wallgate ThriiTap<sup>+</sup> ready for use.
- 5. Upon initial power-up, the Wallgate ThriiTap<sup>+</sup> automatically runs through a 15-second water calibration cycle. This is repeated every time the mains power supply is interrupted. This will also activate the clock on the LCD.
- 6. Ensure no leaks have occurred around the connections between the control module and the tap head.

# Note: A range of compatible liquid soaps & specifications are available from Wallgate.

7. To install the soap container, place the soap container onto its mounting hook, ensure the soap bottle is level and stable.

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


Figure 16: Soap bottle installation/connection.

- 8. Unscrew the cap from the soap container and replace with the push-fit cap pre-connected to the soap tube pushing fully into place ensuring no leaks.
- 9. Press the soap prime switch (the button on the underside of the control module next to the air intake grille and the soap mode switch) until soap is consistently dispensed into the bowl.




Figure 17: Soap prime switch operation.

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- 10. Check the wash & dry cycle operates correctly as per the list of checks below and repeat the cycle at least five times.
- ✓ Soap dispenses.
- ✓ Water dispenses & water is warm (if heated supply is installed).
- ✓ Hand dryer operates.

Note: Soap and water will dispense, and the hand dryer will operate only when the hand sensor detects the presence of hands under the tap head, the water and air will stop when the sensor fails to detect any hands after a period of 2 seconds.

11. Upon completion ensure that a copy of the instruction manual (or leaflet) is passed to the customer.

#### 8. Programmed Settings

The Wallgate ThriiTap<sup>+</sup> operational program is supplied factory set but can be adjusted to suit the end-user requirements.

Any service or repair work must be done by a qualified engineer. During the warranty period, the service or repair must only be done by a Wallgate engineer or appointed service agent. Refer to the Wallgate terms and conditions for warranty information.





Figure 18: Display cover removal.

The display cover must be removed to allow settings to be changed. This can be done by removing the two M3 thumb screws from the cover either by hand or with a flat head screwdriver (Fig 18). The panel must be replaced when the in use to prevent ingress of water into the module.

#### 8.1. Operation

The hand wash and dry cycle is activated when your hands are placed centrally under the tap and dispensing nozzles. An infra-red hand sensor initiates the cycle when it detects hands under the tap head. The sensor beam length is preset to 100mm, this is to be checked and adjusted by the installer using F68 (see section 8.2). When the cycle starts, a sequence of soap, water and hand dryer air are dispensed. Note that the water dispensing, and hand dryer functions include a feature to auto-cancel a cycle that is in operation should the user remove their hands from underneath the tap head before either cycle has completed its preset time. The cycle cancels after the user's hands have been removed from under the tap head (Water 4 sec & Hand drier 2 sec). This feature can be adjusted to increase or decrease the 2 second default time or the feature can be disabled, refer to section 8.2 for information.

#### 8.1.1. Soap Operation

There are 2 settings for soap delivery, FOAM (default) or LIQUID. The rocker switch used to change the soap option is located under the control panel cover on control module. Adjust the switch to position 0 for liquid or position 1 for foam see below:




Figure 20: Soap switch positions

When switching to liquid soap delivery, F8 should be changed to 0.4 (0.4 seconds).

#### 8.1.2. Dryer Operation

There are 3 dryer speed settings. The control to adjust the speed is located on the control module LCD control panel. To change the speed, the Control Module must be powered up (The fan does not need to be operating). On the LCD control, there is a small push button labelled 'Fan Speed' see figure 19. Press and hold this button to select the desired setting, this is confirmed by a five-second fan cycle. (It should be noted that lowering the fan speed will take longer to dry the hands). The dryer is set as "High" by default.

#### 8.1.3. Air Heater Operation

The ThriiTap<sup>+</sup> hand dryer has an air heater installed to ensure the user dries their hands in comfortable, high velocity air. The air heater is set to ON by default however can be turned on or off with the LCD control panel shown in figure 19. Press and hold

button 10 for 2 seconds to switch between the two settings. To show the setting has been confirmed the correct LED will illuminate.

#### 8.1.4. Hygiene Purge

The ThriiTap<sup>+</sup> handwash unit is factory set to **not** run an automatic hygiene purge. The handwash can be set to give a 1-minute water cycle, hygiene purge at 00:00 every day by changing setting F53 to 1. This is the default setting; final settings are the responsibility of the customer and must be based on the specific requirements of their water system. To adjust the settings, follow the instructions in the advanced adjustment section 8.2.1.

#### 8.2. Advanced Adjustment

The unit is supplied with factory settings as shown in Fig. 21 below. Further adjustments can be made to the configuration of the water, soap, air operations, the cycle sequence and the IR sensor trigger or activation length.

Warning! Incorrect alterations to the default hand wash settings may result in malfunctions or possible unit damage. If in any doubt, contact "*Wallgate after-sales service*" for advice & information.

- 1. To change the settings, you will need to enter the programming mode, press and hold 'MENU' and 'ENTER' buttons simultaneously for 5 seconds see figure 19. After this period, the display will read 'F 01'.
- 2. With 'F' menu item displayed (as shown in the Fig.19), momentarily pressing the 'UP' and 'DOWN' buttons will move up and down the menu selection.
- 3. When the desired menu item is selected, press the 'ENTER' button to confirm. The display will show the current value, flashing, for that menu item.
- 4. To adjust the flashing value, press the up or down button as required.
- 5. To save the required value, press the 'ENTER' button. This action saves the value and switches the display back to the selected menu item.
- 6. For further adjustments repeat steps 1 to 5, or to exit the programming mode momentarily press the Menu Select button. A 20 second period of inactivity will automatically exit the programming mode and revert to displaying the time.

#### 8.2.1. Hygiene Purge Adjustment

Follow the instructions in the previous section to enter and navigate the F-Functions menu. F54 and F55 sets the time of day to purge, F56-F62 enable/disable specific days to purge, the repeat setting (F63) refers how many purges required, interval is the time between purges (F64) and the run time (F65) is the water purge time.

#### 9. Care, Routine Maintenance, Service and Repair

The ThriiTap<sup>+</sup> is well designed and manufactured from high-quality materials. If you install, operate, and maintain it according to the instructions given in this manual, the tap will give reliable and efficient service. If you need any further information or advice, please contact Wallgate Customer Services.

#### 9.1. Care and Cleaning

The ThriiTap<sup>+</sup> should be cleaned daily. Follow these 3 steps to ensure the unit performs to its best and remains hygienic. Using the wrong cleaning method or product may invalidate the warranty.

1. Wipe sensor and nozzles using a soft cloth and non-abrasive cleaner.




Figure 23: Tap sensor cleaning.

2. Clean all tap surfaces, sink, mirror and any walls or counter tops.




Figure 24: Surface cleaning.

3. REGULARLY clean air filter on base of control module (under sink). Ensure plughole in sink is free from blockages so water can drain freely.

Note: All cleaning chemicals should be used exactly as indicated by the manufacturer's instructions (including appropriate dilution).

Note: Any chemicals intended for use should first be tested on an inconspicuous area to check suitability.

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#### Chemical guidelines

Most professional cleaning chemicals suitable for stainless steel can be used.

The following are some that are harmful to the ThriiTap+

- Alcohol-acid mixes
- Alcohol Solvent /oil-based mixes
- Quaternary ammonium
- Alkali-bleach mixes
- Foaming ingredients
- Bleach or abrasive cleaners

#### 9.2. Routine Maintenance

The following routine regular maintenance in between service intervals will help to prevent premature parts failure:

- Flush the soap pump system with warm water to remove congealed soap within the pump, tube & soap nozzle.
- Clean the external surfaces of the soap nozzle to remove congealed soap.
- De-scale the water spray nozzle.
- Clean the lens on the infra-red hand sensor.
- Clean the waste outlets on the basin bowl and flush out / clean the waste sump.
- Clean & de-scale the tap head (the water outlet nozzle can be replaced if necessary (see figure 25).
- Check the control module functions of soap, water and dryer dispensing are operating correctly. Any malfunction must be reported so that service repair work can be arranged to avoid further potential damage to the module.
- Clean the solenoid valve inlet filter and diaphragm.
- Inspect external air filter on the bottom of the control module for dust and debris, clean or replace the filter mesh if blocked (see figure 25).

Warning! Switch OFF the electrical power to the module in the event of a serious fault or if the module fails to operate.

#### 9.3. Service and Repair

Service warning indicator: The LCD display shown in figure 19 will show "Ser" when a recommended service is required or alternatively it is recommended that the unit is serviced every 56000 cycles or a minimum of once per annum.

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# Note: Service warning indicator reset: Press & hold buttons 3&5 together for 4 seconds.

Any service or repair work must be done by a qualified engineer. During the warranty period, the service or repair must only be done by a Wallgate engineer or appointed service agent. Refer to the Wallgate terms and conditions for warranty information.

Warning! Risk of electric shock, serious injury or death. Only qualified personnel should remove the cover of the control module when powered up.
